□ IMPORTANCE OF VOCATIONAL TRAINING FOR SOFT SKILLS:

Jatindra Rajendra Mahavidyalaya is aware that traditionally vocational training focused on technical proficiency necessary for certain amount of specific careers. However, employers nowadays increasingly prioritize on the soft skills due to their role in workplace productivity, teamwork dynamics, and client interactions. Therefore integrating soft skills development with vocational training ensures our graduates possess a well-rounded skill set, enhancing their employability and career advancement prospects in their future.

□ OBJECTIVES OF THE SOFT SKILL ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM:

The soft skill enhancement program is designed to complement technical training by the George Telegraph Training Institute of Berhampore Centre through structured modules delivered alongside vocational features. Key components included were:

- Soft skill modules are integrated into the vocational training curriculum, emphasizing practical application and real-world scenarios relevant to the profession. These were highlighted during this programme.
- *Programme* covered a range of soft skills such as communication, teamwork, leadership, time management, adaptability, and emotional intelligence.

• Some outlines were shared with the students on resume writing, interview techniques, professional etiquette, and networking that are essentially incorporated to prepare students for job placement and career advancement.

□ NOTABLE CHALLENGES AND CONSIDERATIONS:

- *Resource Allocation:* Our College struggles to find funding allocation adequately to enhance resources for soft skill training, including qualified instructors and relevant materials, which are very much essential for realizing program effectiveness.
- *Curriculum Integration:* IQAC learned that seamless integration of soft skill modules to some add on and value added courses that support to provide vocational training, careful planning and collaboration between academic and industry partners at the local level.
- *Evaluation and Assessment:* IQAC requires developing robust methods to assess soft skill proficiency and provide constructive feedback that is crucial for continuous improvement.




CONCLUSION:
