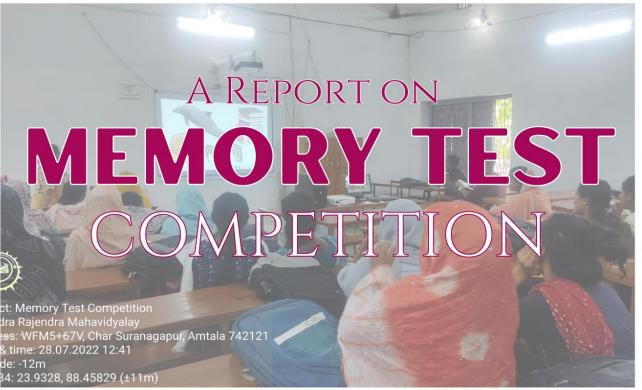
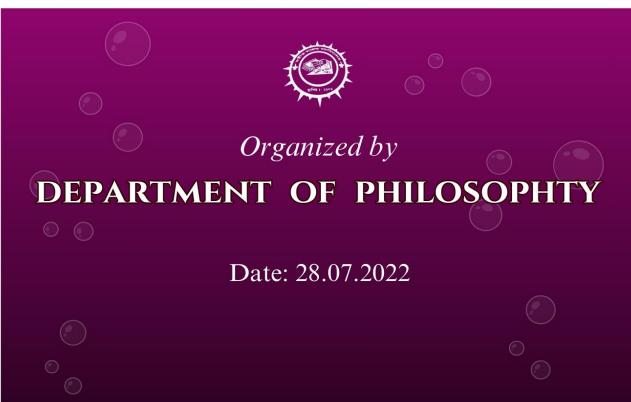

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A Report on **MEMORY TEST COMPETITION**

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■ INTRODUCTION:

Memory Testing is one kind of methods and manipulations that serve to enhance power of retention and recollection of information that is presented to the students in various learning contexts and has been a mainstay in the area of teaching and learning process. A memory competition is an event where students test their memorization abilities against each other. It tests the capabilities of Working Memory, Short-Term Memory, and Long-Term Memory. Working Memory is the sensory information store based on various sensory organs such as eyes, ears, touch etc and the brain protects information from such sources. To retrieve that information requires a great amount of attention. Attention means that the brain protects the information from other interferences for higher level of thoughts in search of meaning. Short-Term Memory is a limited store for information and becomes inaccessible due to arrival of new information; thus such information is easily forgotten or lost. But repetition or rehearsals might retrieve such information. Long-Term Memory deals with large and different types of events, perceptual skills, knowledge and facts. Memory Testing Competition aims at the findings of factors that affect accessibility of information from memory like conditioning of memory during storage, the frequency of usage, similarity between the new information and existing ones and uniqueness of information.

OVERVIEW:

Human memory storage works by first storing information in the working memory, where it is actively processed and stored for retrieval at a later time. This stored information can be recalled when needed. Likewise the Department of Philosophy organized a Memory Test Competition, for the honours students of philosophy and those interested, on 28th July, 2022 from 2.00 p.m. to 3.00 p.m. This competition was designed to improve the students' short-term memory and its instant processing skills of information along with speed-recognition skills and Long-Term Memory skills as well. The students were given only five minutes to see 80 photographs which were hanged across the white board of the room no. 13. After the allotted time for visualization, they were taken down by the teachers and the students were given only 10 minutes to write them down on their own papers. Students completed this task with great enthusiasm.

■ AIMS AND OBJECTIVES:

- To enhance memory by linking of observed pictures to associable items in memory,
- To determine familiarity between pictures easily
- To improve a long-term retention of the items to a greater degree,
- To develop recall and sequencing skills of the students,
- To assess short-term memory capabilities of the students,
- To detect cognitive skills and problems,
- To know how quickly students can process information

■ PROCEDURE AND ANALYSIS:

Memory Testing Competition is designed to measure the strength and capability of students' long-term memory and short-term memory also. For testing the long-term memory, we presented a series of 80 different photographs hanged along the white board of the class room for a period of five minutes. Then we asked the students to see them and remember them. After the allotted time of five minutes the photographs were taken down and students were asked to write them by recalling them.
