4	Course Objective	The basic objective of this course is to facilitate students to participate enthusiastically in all aspects of peace studies, peace-building in conflict and post-conflict societies. It will help them in the understanding of Gandhian approach to peace and non-violence from the interdisciplinary perspective and comprehend Gandhi's ideals and perceptions on political, socio-economic, environmental and developmental issues. The course provides opportunities to the learners for higher studies in the area of theoretical and applied Gandhian Studies, Peace, Conflict Management, Social Regeneration focusing on women upliftment and rural regeneration.
5	Programme Highlights and Unique Features	The syllabus will explore Gandhi, the man behind the legend, as well as his philosophy of <i>ahimsa</i> , non-violence. Mahatma Gandhi and his principles have great relevance in this era of Globalization. The course aims at training the students in the art of participatory management and peaceful methods of conflict resolution. An

		interesting and well-planned mix of lectures, and activities will contribute towards the overall personality development of students by helping them to discover their latent talents and instilling in them leadership qualities.



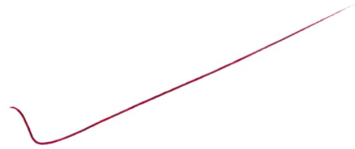
