DISTRICT CONFERENCE OF COLLEGE EMPLOYEES' ASSOCIATION

Title of the Programme	: District Conference of College Employees' Association

Introduction:

A District Conference of College Employees' Association has been organized by the PF and Service Book Sub-Committee of JRM and the West Bengal College Employees' Association on 16th September, 2018 in Room No. 7 of our College at 12 O'clock. 215 employees from 26 different colleges across the Murshidabad district have participated in the conference with the purpose of highlighting their pressing issues faced by college employees and to discuss future strategies for improving their working conditions, professional development, and policy advocacy.

Objectives:

The conference was organized with the demands of the followings:

- Two increments to head clerks have to be implemented,
- Direct recruitment of college staff from Group D to Group C,
- Regularization of temporary staff,

- Introduction of minimum pay scale till regularization,
- Introduction of university pay scale,
- Order for regularization of part-time sweepers,
- Providing employment to a family member in case of death of an employee while on duty.

Opening Ceremony:

Chief Guests for the Conference were welcomed by the President of the Governing Body, JRM and ushered them for the enkindling the light. Hence the conference was inaugurated with the lightning of the lamps by the dignitaries who were present on the dais. The whole programme was anchored by Mr. Pranab Ghosh, the Convener of PF and Service Book Sub-Committee, who organized the whole event in a very profound manner.

Key Discussions and Resolutions of Lecture Series:

The inaugural address was delivered by Mr. Tarun Bhattacharya, State Secretary of West Bengal College Employee Association, who highlighted the critical role of college employees in shaping the educational landscape of West Bengal. He pointed out that the non-teaching staff of any institute function as the backbone of the service who usually perform their duties like nourishing and bringing up a child in a family.

After finishing the inaugural address, the keynote address was delivered Mr. Naba Kumar Pal, the District Secretary of WBCEA and he emphasized the importance of continuous professional development and the need for better support systems for employees. He connected the support service to their own life by logically equating the same with that of the state Government which in return does not fulfill the entire service conditions to its college employees. Thus he channelized their conference to core issue. He mentioned their pressing issues one after the other. Mr. Debabrata Sarkar, the President of Governing Body of JRM and Mrs. Sucharita Mitra, Associate Professor of JRM were also highlighted their points.

Panel Discussions were held with experts from various fields, including education, labor rights, and technology and the following key findings were pointed out:

- *Improving Employee Welfare:* Experts discussed strategies to enhance welfare schemes for college employees, including health insurance, retirement benefits, and mental health support.
- *Innovative Teaching Methods:* This panel focused on modern teaching methodologies and the use of technology to improve student engagement and learning outcomes.
- *Role of Non-Teaching Staff:* Recognizing the crucial role of non-teaching staff, discussions were held on how to improve their working conditions, training, and career advancement opportunities.

Key Issues and Challenges:

- **Salary and Other Benefits:**

A significant part of this conference had focused on the demands for fair salaries and enhancement benefits for all West Bengal College Employees. WBCEA had resolved to push forward the implementation of their legitimate long-standing demands in all colleges across the state for the benefits of people.

- **Improvement of Working Conditions:**

Another concern of the employees was about the working conditions to be improved such as infrastructure development, ease of workload, and safety measures etc were vehemently raised. The Association decided to form a committee in the Murshidabad district level to regularly monitor and report on their issues to be ensured that they are promptly addressed.

- **Professional Development Initiatives:**

Emphasis was also placed on the need for regular training and development for the employees to cope up with the advancement of new technologies. Collaborations through MoUs with reputed institutions for workshops, seminars, and online courses were proposed to enhance their skills and knowledge.

- **Inclusion in Policy Advocacy:**

The conference discussed the importance of active participation in policy-making processes that their genuine demands are raised in the legislative assembly for the purpose of sensitization and transparency.

- **Technology and Digitalization:**

The integration of technology in administrative and teaching processes was highlighted during the discussion in this conference. The Association committed to support all kinds of initiatives to promote digital literacy among the employees and the use of advanced technology in educational institutions.

Conclusion

The delegates shared their opinion about the Conference more precisely. The valedictory session was concluded with a vote of thanks by Mr. Debabrata Sarkar, the President of Governing Body of JRM. He expressed gratitude to all the participants, speakers, and organizers for their contributions to the successful event. The resolutions passed during the conference will guide the Association's activities in the coming year, with a focus on achieving tangible improvements in the lives of college employees in West Bengal.

Future Plans

The Association announced its plan to hold regional meetings to ensure that the issues discussed at the conference are addressed at the grassroots level to garner public support. Additionally the district association vowed to make a follow-up conference for next year to review the progress made and to set new goals.

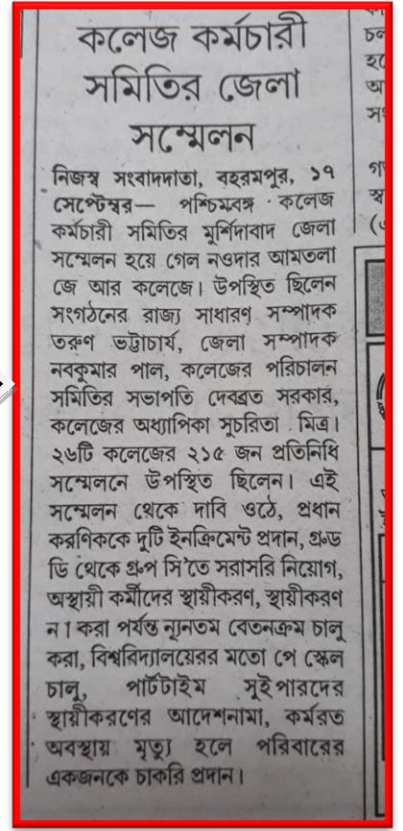
District Conference of College Employees' Association

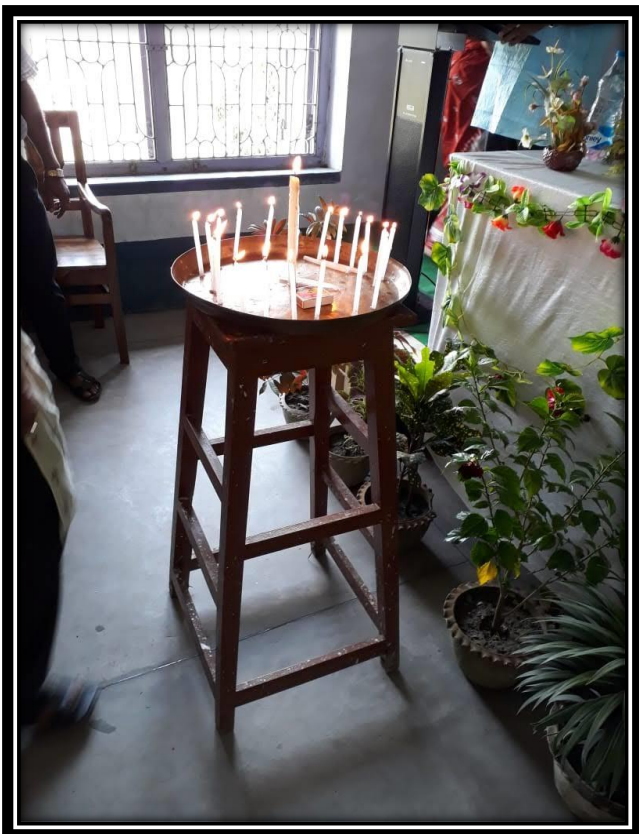

Awareness Programme on “Swachwata Hi Sewa”

INTRODUCTION: Swachh Bharat Mission, the world’s largest sanitation initiative was launched by the Prime Minister of India in 2014 to achieve an Open Defecation Free India by October 2, 2019, as a tribute to Mahatma Gandhi. The Hon’ble Prime Minister of India had urged the people of his nation to participate in a collective cleanliness campaign, “Swachwata Hi Sewa” (Cleanliness is Service), from 15th September 2017 to Gandhi Jayanti on 2nd October 2017. During his “Mann Ki Baat” address on August 27, 2017, he called upon people to help the government promote an environment of cleanliness in the entire country so that the coming 2nd October, the third anniversary of the Swachh Bharat Mission and Gandhi Jayanti, can be celebrated in a befitting manner. He urged all NGOs, schools, colleges, social, cultural and political leaders, corporates, government officials, collectors and sarpanches, to accelerate Swachhta activities during the September 15 – October 2 period of 2017.

OBJECTIVE: To pay homage to our national hero and this governmental scheme the NSS Unit of Jatindra-Rajendra Mahavidyalaya had arranged quite a significant number of cleanliness drives both within the college and beyond the campus during the academic session 2017-18. To reiterate

the importance of this ongoing mission they had arranged a cleanliness drive in front of the College Halt Bus Stoppage and neighboring Amtala High School on 24.09.2018 to make people, especially the students of the locality, aware of the importance of handling waste responsibly and exemplified ways of achieving this goal as a prerequisite towards a cleaner and greener environment. Adopting the motto “Swachwata hi Seva”, 28 NSS volunteers along with 2 teaching and 2 non-teaching staff, carried out a cleanliness campaign on the outskirts of the school; advocated cleaning of all its toilets, classrooms and restrooms on a daily basis; disseminated significant information related to health, hygiene and sanitation; encouraged the use of eco-friendly items and emphasized the need of cautious regulation of waste generation and disposal.

OUTCOME: The awareness drive was aimed to generate greater public participation, reinforce the concept of “sanitation as everyone’s business” and offer tribute to Mahatma Gandhi with a wide reaching campaign. 



Field visit at Nalanda, Bihar on and from 8th December to 11th December, 2018

1. Introduction:

The field visit of B.A Part III Honours program of Academic Session of 2016-2017 was conducted the Nalanda, Bihar. It helps them to present their research practice in future.

Nalanda was an ancient Mahavihara, a revered Buddhist monastery which also served as a renowned centre of learning, in the ancient kingdom of Magadha (modern-day Bihar) in India. The university of Nalanda obtained significant fame, prestige and relevance during ancient times, and rose to legendary status due to its contribution to the emergence of India as a great power around the fourth century. The site is located about 95 kilometers (59 mi) southeast of Patna near the city of Bihar Sharif, and was one of the greatest centres of learning in the world from the fifth century CE to c. 1200 CE. Today, it is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. At its peak the school attracted scholars and students from near and far, with some travelling from Tibet, China, Korea, and Central Asia. The highly formalised methods of Buddhist studies helped the establishment of large teaching institutions such as Taxila, Nalanda, and Vikramashila, which are often characterised as India's early universities. Archaeological evidence also notes contact with the Shailendra dynasty of Indonesia, one of whose kings built a monastery in the complex. Nalanda flourished under the patronage of the Gupta Empire in the 5th and 6th centuries, and later under Harsha, the emperor of Kannauj. The liberal cultural traditions inherited from the Gupta age resulted in a period of growth and prosperity until the ninth century CE. The subsequent centuries were a time of gradual decline, a period during which the tantric developments of Buddhism became most pronounced in eastern India under the Pala Empire. According to the prescribed syllabus of UGB of Part-III honours students one field work have to undertake. Field visit and writing Dissertation is an important part of the syllabus. It is the easiest way to improve subject knowledge. Dissertation writing could help them in getting better at the academic writing. Field visit will help the students to improve their analytical and cognitive abilities.

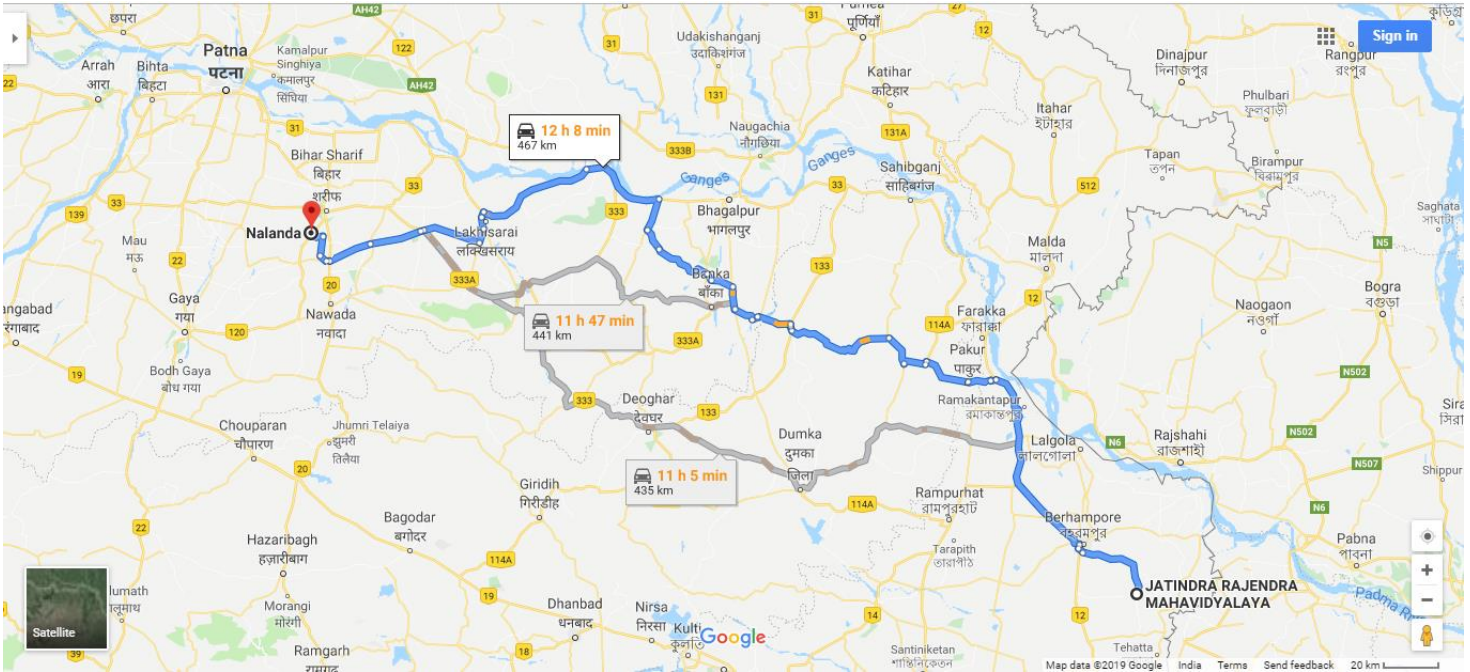
2. Objectives:

3. Study Area:

Nalanda University was located in Nalanda, Bihar as a budhhist Monestary. Its length was 240 meter (800 ft),width 490 meter(1600 ft),total area is 12 hectares(30 acres) . It was build by Karmagupta-I in 5th century and was abandoned by 13th of century. It was a mixed culture places of Budhhism and Hinduism and was ransacked by Bakhtiar Khalji in 1200 CE.

REPORT ON NSS EXTENSION ACTIVITY

Awareness programme on "Safe Drive Save Life"

Date of the Event: 20-03-2019

Place of the Event: Outside College Campus, in front Amtala Primary School and Ghat Para-Amtala College Road Junction Point.

INTRODUCTION: The appalling rise in cases of road accidents and resultant casualty and loss had lead the State Government of India to reevaluate and reconsider the efficacy of road safety measures implemented across the State. The Honorable Chief Minister of West Bengal had taken up this grave matter in 2016 and initiated a campaign across the state entitled "Safe Drive, Save Life" to curb accidents and fatalities. The campaign was launched in a workshop, on 8th of July, 2016, from Nazrul Mancha in Kolkata and was fairly represented by the officials and law enforcing agencies of the State Government and Local Self Governments. The programme was organized jointly by the Transport Department and the Police Department. The primary aim of this campaign, which soon became a movement, was to inculcate a sense of responsibility and caution with regard to driving and road safety.

OBJECTIVE: To promote the "road safety through greater enforcement, better engineering and equipment mobilization and intensive awareness building", as stated by our Honorable C.M.

REPORT: The NSS Unit of J.R.M. organized an awareness campaign on 20.03.2019 in front of Amtala Primary School and Ghat Para-Amtala College Road Junction Point. The volunteers included 3 teaching and 4 non-teaching staff and 53 students who urged the local inhabitants and the school going students coming from surrounding areas to follow traffic rules strictly for ensuring the safety and security of not only themselves but all the other people travelling via roads.

They also advocated wearing of helmets for bike rides, fastening car seat belts while driving, abstaining from consumption of liquor while riding on the driver's seat, avoiding phone calls while driving, abiding by speed limit signs, refraining from hitting pedestrians and so on.

OUTCOME: The campaign elicited an overwhelming response from all present on the occasion and the volunteers are looking forward to arranging more such awareness programmes in future for raising public awareness about such relevant issues.

REPORT ON NSS EXTENSION ACTIVITY

Awareness camp on dengue

There is no denying the fact that a lot of diseases can be traced back to unhygienic conditions and irresponsible waste disposal. Swachh Bharat Mission, the world's largest sanitation initiative was launched by the Prime Minister of India in 2014 to achieve an Open Defecation Free India by October 2, 2019, as a tribute to Mahatma Gandhi. To pay homage to our national hero and this governmental scheme, the NSS Unit of our college ensures regular cleanliness campaigns on the campus; facilitates cleaning of all toilets, classrooms, departments and restrooms on a daily basis; organizes awareness programmes and extension campaigns related to health, hygiene and sanitation; encourages the use of eco-friendly items and cautiously regulates waste generation and disposal within the college premises.

The outbreak of dengue fever is a menace in regions like Amtala which is located in the Naoda CD Block of Murshidabad. Each year, up to 400 million people are infected by the dengue virus worldwide, approximately 100 million people get sick from this infection and around 40,000 populace die from severe dengue. In view of this alarming social concern, the N.S.S volunteers of our college have organized dengue awareness campaigns in different areas of Amtala on several occasions during the academic session 2019-20. An Awareness Camp on Dengue was organized on 12.06.2019 and 31 participants visited the village of Kanapara to conduct a hygiene awareness session and empower communities with life-saving knowledge and information related to the disease of dengue. The primary agenda of this programme was to check a major upsurge of communicable illnesses like dengue, malaria, typhoid, diarrheal diseases, tuberculosis, etc. as well as several non-communicable diseases by explaining their causes and the methods and techniques

for effecting their cure in this rural, underprivileged region. The NSS volunteers further ensured basic sanitation supplies and distributed hygiene kits (mosquito nets have been delivered at regular intervals to the economically burdened families) among the socially vulnerable inhabitants of Kanapara and educated the masses about the need of safe sanitation in both urban and rural households. The N.S.S unit has thus played a pivotal role in fostering awareness among the inhabitants of this village through their extension activity and have acquainted them with ways of combating this highly infectious disease.

Report on NSS-conducted Extension Programme

Title of the Extn. Programme: Canvassing the Benefits of Reservation Policy among the Tribal People

Date of the Programme: July 8th 2019

Venue of the Programme: Singhpara, Nowda



Introduction

The NSS unit of Jatindra Rajendra Mahavidyalaya conducted an extension programme on July 8th 2019 at Singhpara, Nowda, a tribal locality, to create awareness about their constitutional rights and to encourage them to redeem 7.5% job reservations in all government posts.

Objectives

Though Indian constitution guarantees 7.5% reservations for the scheduled tribe communities in all educational institutions and in the government jobs. The general awareness about the rights of the tribal people is menacingly poor. Resultantly after 76 years of Independence, the ST communities still lack behind in all spheres of life. They are socially and economically extremely backward. The primary objectives of the programme were:

1. To create general awareness about the constitutional rights among the tribal people
2. To Inform the ST communities that 7.5% seats in school and colleges are reserved for them
3. Intimate the ST job aspirants the fact that 7.5% posts in all government offices are reserved for them

Activities Conducted

The programme included the following activities:

1. JRM NSS unit visited Singhpara ST colony with flexes, festoons, and handouts.
2. Conducted door to door visit
3. The team met with male, female, and children of the community and tried to inspire and enlighten them about the constitutional opportunities they can make use of to economically and socially rise up.


Participation

The college NSS unit incorporated 23 active members in its campaign. The was led by 3 faculty members. Some local social activists spontaneously joined the NSS team to mobilize the backward community. The team chiefly targeted the guardians and urged them to send their kids to schools and to continue their fight till the goal of higher education is achieved. The team emphasised the community that they are the root of Indian civilization and should work hard and claim their lawful rights. The students of the community were mostly ignorant and some of them had dropped out. The NSS team highlighted the role of education to them.

Programme Outcomes

The extension programme successfully achieved its objectives with the following notable outcomes:

1. The local ST communities were deeply delighted by the earnest endeavour of the college to make them aware about their rights.
2. NSS team members learnt the social realities of the backward ST communities and resolved to continue their social drive for the overall upliftment of the society.
3. The mothers were inspired to send their kids to schools. They were overjoyed learning the fact that their children could become government employees after weaponizing education and constitutional rights.
4. Some school and college drop-outs assured the NSS team and the faculty members to resume their educational journey.



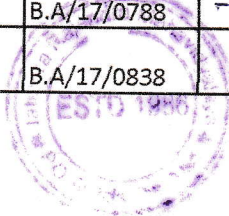

Field visit at Shantiniketan, Birbhum (Viswa Bharati University) on and from 09th February to 10th February, 2020

1. Introduction:

The field visit of B.A Part III Honours program of Academic Session of 2019-2020 was conducted the Shantiniketan, Bolpur. It helps them to present their research practice in future. In 1863, Debendranath Tagore took on permanent lease 20 acres (81,000 m²) of land, with two chhatim (alstonia scholaris) trees, at a yearly payment of Rs. 5, from Bhuban Mohan Sinha, the talukdar of Raipur, Birbhum. He built a guest house there and named it Shantiniketan (the abode of peace). Gradually, the whole area came to be known as Shantiniketan.

Rabindranath Tagore first visited Shantiniketan in 1873 when he was 12 years old. In 1888, Debendranath dedicated the entire property for the establishment of a Brahmavidyalaya through a trust deed. In 1901, Rabindranath started a Brahmacharyaashrama and it came to be known as Patha Bhavana from 1925. In 1913, Rabindranath Tagore won the Nobel Prize in Literature. It was a new feather in the cap of the Tagore family which was the leading family contributing to the enrichment of life and society in Bengal in many fields of activity over a long period of time. The environment at Jorasanko Thakur Bari, one of the bases of the Tagore family in Kolkata, was filled with literature, music, painting, and theatre. Founded in 1921 by Rabindranath Tagore, Visva Bharati was declared to be a central university and an institute of national importance, in 1951.

According to the prescribed syllabus of UGB of Part-III honours students one field work have to undertake. Field visit and writing Dissertation is an important part of the syllabus. It is the easiest way to improve subject knowledge. Dissertation writing could help them in getting better at the academic writing. Field visit will help the students to improve their analytical and cognitive abilities.

2. Objectives:

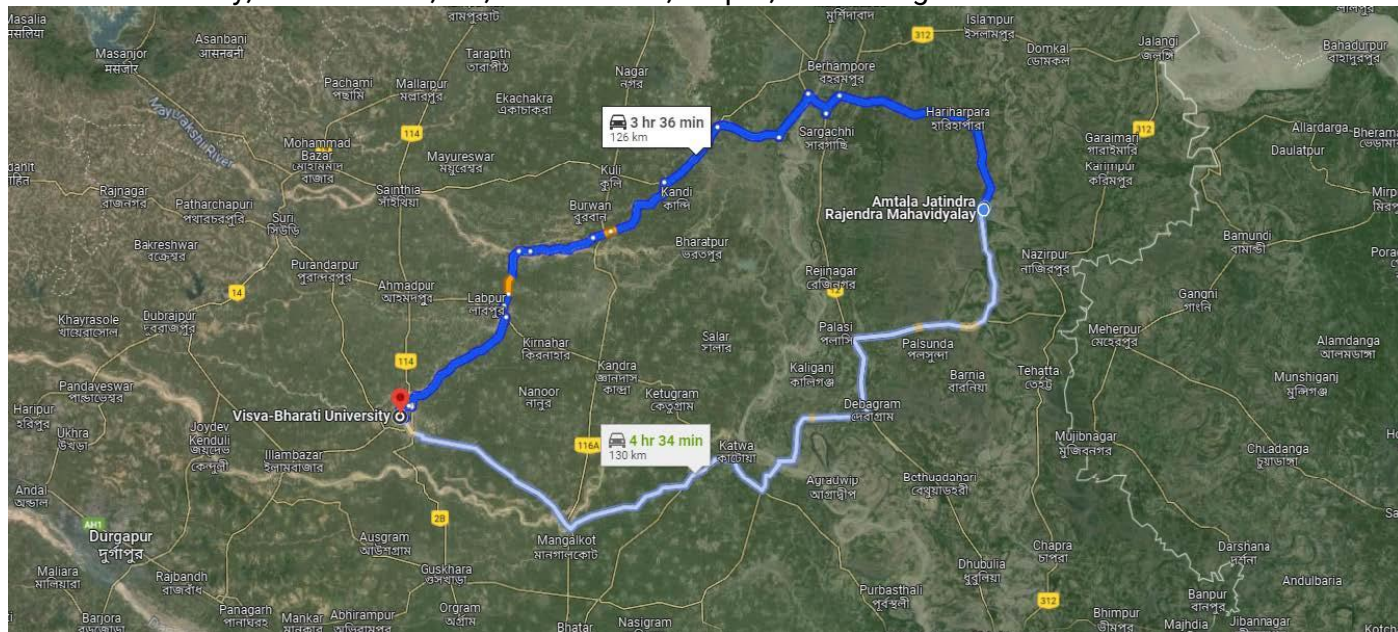
- ✧ Offers the perfect informal setup for discussion, dialogues and experiences which helps in developing various life-skills.
- ✧ To accept the importance of differences and diversity and to be sensitive to every individual, historical places irrespective of the difference in opinions.

Shantiniketan is a neighborhood of Bolpur city in Bolpur subdivision of Birbhum district in West Bengal, India, approximately 152 km north of Kolkata . It was established by Maharshi Devendranath Tagore, and later expanded by his son Rabindranath Tagore whose vision became what is now a university town with the creation of Visva-Bharati.

Day 2: 10th February 2020, after breakfast at hotel visit all the departments or Bhavana one by one and Tagore Ashrama One of the most valued places in all of Santiniketan, Tagore's Ashram is located in the Uttrayan Complex. It is the place that Tagore's father first built when he arrived many years ago. After lunch visit Rabindra Bhavan Museum, Amar Kutir and Poush Mela math. After lunch will their go to Kankalitala, The small rural town is located about 7 km from Santiniketan. The cyclonic storm termed “Yaas” ravaged the coastal states of Orissa and West Bengal in the last week of May in 2021. Designated as a Category 1-equivalent tropical cyclone whose severity was intense, Yaas devastated more than 4,500 villages of West Bengal. Various rural communities and agricultural lands were hard-hit, and basic needs such as drinking water, sanitation, and the like were mostly unavailable during this troubled time. A preliminary report submitted to the Central Government of India by the officials of West Bengal estimated a loss of ₹210 billion (US\$2.89 billion). The local residents of Sunderban Mangrove Forest were among the worst affected victims of this natural calamity and were in need of immediate relief aid in the wake of this disastrous phenomenon.

On the initiative of three colleges of West Bengal – Bangavasi Evening College of Kolkata; Sewnarayan Rameswar Fatepuria College and Jatindra Rajendra Mahavidyalaya of Murshidabad – adequate arrangements were made to deliver relief goods to the Yaas victims in some of the islands of Sundarbans during 7th-9th June, 2021. Three joint community kitchens were temporarily set up to feed the flood-affected people living in Kumirmari and Sonargaon areas under Gosaba block of Sundarban. To this end, a stock of pulses, potatoes,

onions, ginger, garlic, edible oil, cooking spices, eggs, soybeans, and so on groceries were supplied to these affected regions. By making provision of these relief items for the noble purpose of delivering food to the needy and hungry people, at least two nutritious meals a day were provided to nearly 2,000 vulnerable people in the flooded islands of the Sundarban forest. It was a very humble endeavor on the part of the staff of Jatindra-Rajendra Mahavidyalaya, to personally contributed to the Relief Funds created for this purpose, and give assistance and support to some of those in need of relief consequent to the damages wrought by a natural disaster.

REPORT ON NSS EXTENSION ACTIVITY

Awareness Programme on “Omicron Virus” and Mask Distribution

Date of the Event: 14-12-2021

Place of the Event: College Halt Bus Stoppage and Infront of Amtala High School, Amtala Annadamani Valika Vidyalaya (H.S.) Amtala, Nowda, Murshidabad

No. of Attendees: 44 [including Teaching & Non-Teaching stuffs and Students]

INREODUCTION: In the battle against COVID-19, Omicron has been a difficult opponent. The variant of the SARS-CoV-2 virus that causes COVID-19 first surfaced in the United States toward the end of 2021 and spread like wildfire, spawning new sub-strains—some more transmissible than others. WHO designated Omicron as a variant of concern (VOC) due to its many mutations, leading to higher risk of transmission and possible resistance to vaccination. As the level of a variant’s threat depends on how infectious it is, how well vaccines and prior COVID-19 infection protect against infection, transmission, clinical disease, and death, and how virulent it is compared to other variants, the overall threat posed by the Omicron VOC is very high.

OBJECTIVE: As the higher risk of the OMICRON virus is evolving so the it is imperative to understand that we all need to take collective measures and necessary precautions to prevent further spread of OMICRON virus. NSS Unit of JRM reiterating and urging to abide by Covid norms and appropriate behavior.

REPORT: The N.S.S volunteers of Jatindra-Rajendra Mahavidyalaya played a pivotal role in fostering awareness among the rural population of Amtala during the surge of Omicron virus in the concluding month of 2021. On 14.12.2021 4 teaching and 2 non-teaching staff and 41 students, as representatives of the NSS Unit of J.R.M., distributed masks and sanitizers outside the college campus and in the neighboring areas of our educational institution and acquainted them with ways of combating this highly infectious disease.

OUTCOME: Volunteers urged people to maintain safe distance from each other and take proper care of their personal hygiene regimen (for instance, washing hands regularly and sanitizing groceries and clothes on a daily basis). They enumerated the varied symptoms of the omicron variant such as a scratchy or sore throat, sneezing or a runny nose, fever – a temperature of 38°C and over, tiredness, a new or worsening cough, shortness of breath, loss of smell, headache/body aches, nausea/vomiting, and/or diarrhea or loose bowel movements. The volunteers further advised the local residents to stop the spread by isolating, tracking Omicron symptoms (if a Covid test has not yet been conducted, then prepare to arrange for a Rapid Antigen test or a PCR test) and taking sufficient rest to recuperate. It was an effective programme as many illiterate and semi-literate masses were unaware yet of the perils associated with this virus and were appropriately guided to combat this VOC.

Introduction:

The NSS unit of Jatindra Rajendra Mahavidyalaya organised an awareness drive for the cessation of the evil social system of dowry on March 4th 2022 at Sankoa, Nowda.

REPORT ON NSS EXTENSION ACTIVITY RIVER CONSERVATION DRIVE

Massive environmental degradation is a global concern in the 21st century. Ozone layer depletion, global warming, rapid climate change, resource exhaustion, loss of biodiverse ecosystems and the threat of increasing occurrences of natural calamities are some of the many challenges facing the human civilization today. The major causes behind this alarming phenomenon are deforestation, urbanization, unchecked pollution, exploitation of natural resources and population explosion. In this acute critical period, it is a requisite need of the hour to reconsider our actions and take adequate steps to resist further damage and decay of our environment. As charity begins at home, the college fraternity is dedicated to ensure environment friendly measures for eventually bringing about an optimistic outlook about environmental sustainability not just within but even beyond the premises of the college.

Rivers are associated with the essence of survival as they provide the most basic and indispensable need of human beings – water. The conservation of river water in the age of modern technology is of utmost importance not only for our immediate corporeal health but also for ensuring the well-being of our succeeding generations. Unfortunately, water pollutants like harmful chemicals, toxic elements, radioactive substances, sewage, pathogenic microorganisms, etc. contaminate water bodies and create major health hazards. Some of the water conservation

initiatives in the past few decades in India include the National River Conservation Plan (NRCP), which was commenced with the introduction of the Ganga Action Plan (GAP) in 1985; Jal Shakti Abhiyan (JSA) in 2019; Amrit Sarovar Mission in 2022.

With the pressing need to address the critical issue of conserving rivers and other water bodies for the sake of preserving ecological balance, resisting biodiversity loss and sustaining the human civilization, the N.S.S Unit of J.R.M. had arranged a cleanliness and conservation drive on the shores of Jalangi river in Amtala, Murshidabad on 31.03.2022 to make people aware of the importance of handling waste responsibly and exemplified ways of achieving this goal as a prerequisite towards a cleaner and greener environment. As pollutants are plaguing our planet and adversely impacting qualities of life, health, productivity, and general welfare, the 67 participants in this awareness programme have generated environmental consciousness and concern by painstakingly cleaning the riverbank of Jalangi in the area adjacent Amtala of Murshidabad district. These NSS volunteers have also informed the people residing near the river to refrain from discarding plastic and other non-degradable materials which can harm marine life and also lead to potential dangers for humans. The participants have further elaborated upon the sustainability and effectiveness of waste management which involves the practice of “5Rs” – ‘R’efuse (saying no to things that are not necessary, such as single-use plastics or excessive packaging), ‘R’educer (emphasizing the importance of minimizing the amount of waste generated by using fewer resources and being more conscious of consumption.), ‘R’euse (instead of disposing of items after a single use, considering finding ways to reuse them, involving repurposing items or using durable goods that have a longer

lifespan), 'R'epurpose (giving items a new purpose or use, extending their lifespan, and reducing waste) and 'R'ecycle (processing used materials into new products, reducing the need for raw materials, and lowering their overall environmental impact).



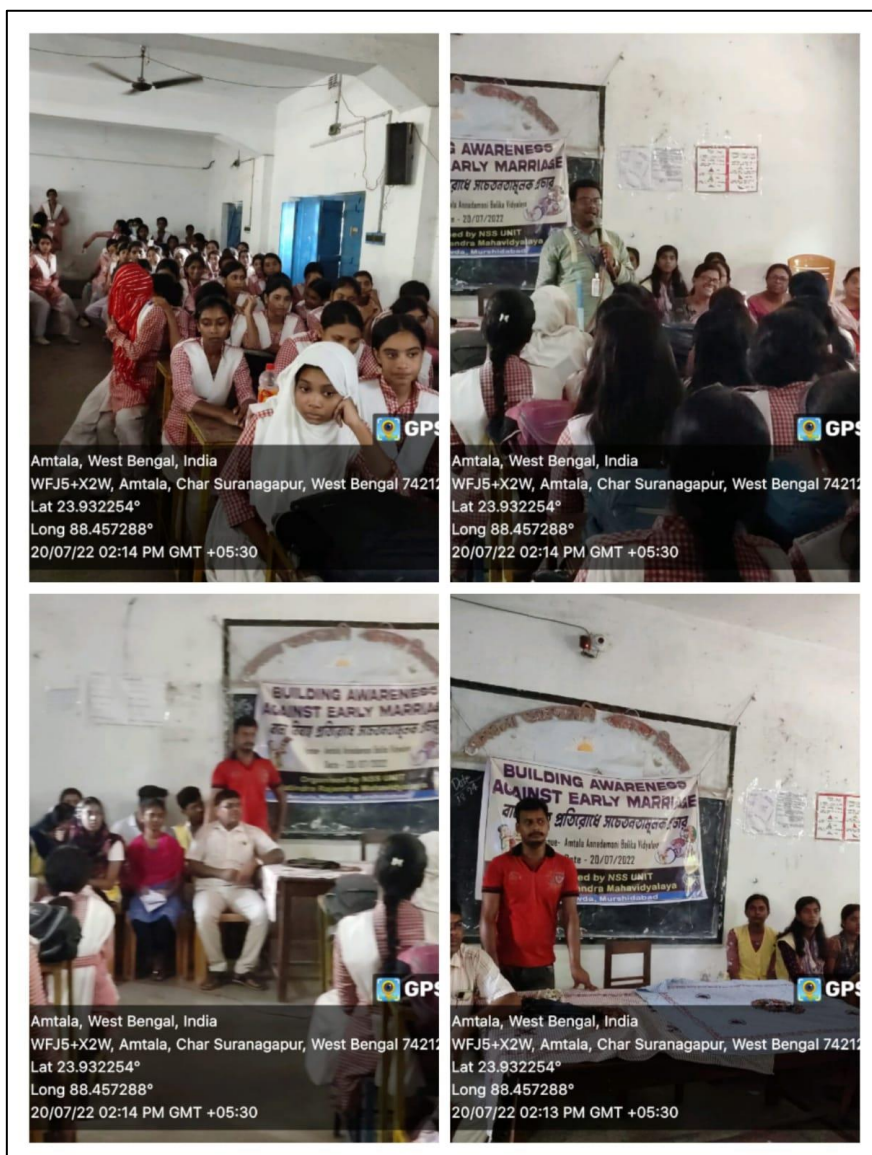

Introduction:

The NSS unit of Jatindra Rajendra Mahavidyalaya conducted an extension programme on July 20th 2022 at Annadamani Balika Vidyalaya, Adjacent Girls School, to create awareness against Early/Child Marriage in the locality. The problem of Child Marriage is acute in West Bengal in general & Murshidabad district in particular.

Though the Government of India guarantees the provisions of the Child Marriage Restraint Act (CMRA) but still the district of Murshidabad in general and Nowda Block in particular has been identified as a child marriage prone block. Therefore, the primary objective of the programme was:

1. To reach to the girls' students (both Hindus & Muslim) of Annadamani Balika Vidyalaya against Early Marriage.
2. To highlight the demerits of Child Marriage from the Health & Legal point of view.
3. To caution the Priests and Kazis of the locality who perform Child Marriages as a criminal activity.

Activities Conducted:

The programme included the following activities:

1. JRM NSS unit visited Annadamani Balika Vidyalaya with flexes, festoons, and handouts.
2. The volunteers met the Headmistress of the above school & requested to cooperate with them in conducting the said programme.
3. The team met the students during their Assembly period & the Coordinator of the NSS delivered a lecture regarding the abuses of Early Marriage. He highlighted the fact that if any girl student gets married before completing her school education, she will be deprived of Kanyashree Scheme of the West Bengal Government.
4. All the girls took a vow of not marrying before reaching adulthood.

The college NSS unit incorporated 23 active members in its campaign. The was led by 2 faculty members. Some local social activists spontaneously joined the NSS team to mobilize the girl students. The team chiefly emphasised the value of education on one hand and the demerits of Child Marriage on the other hand. 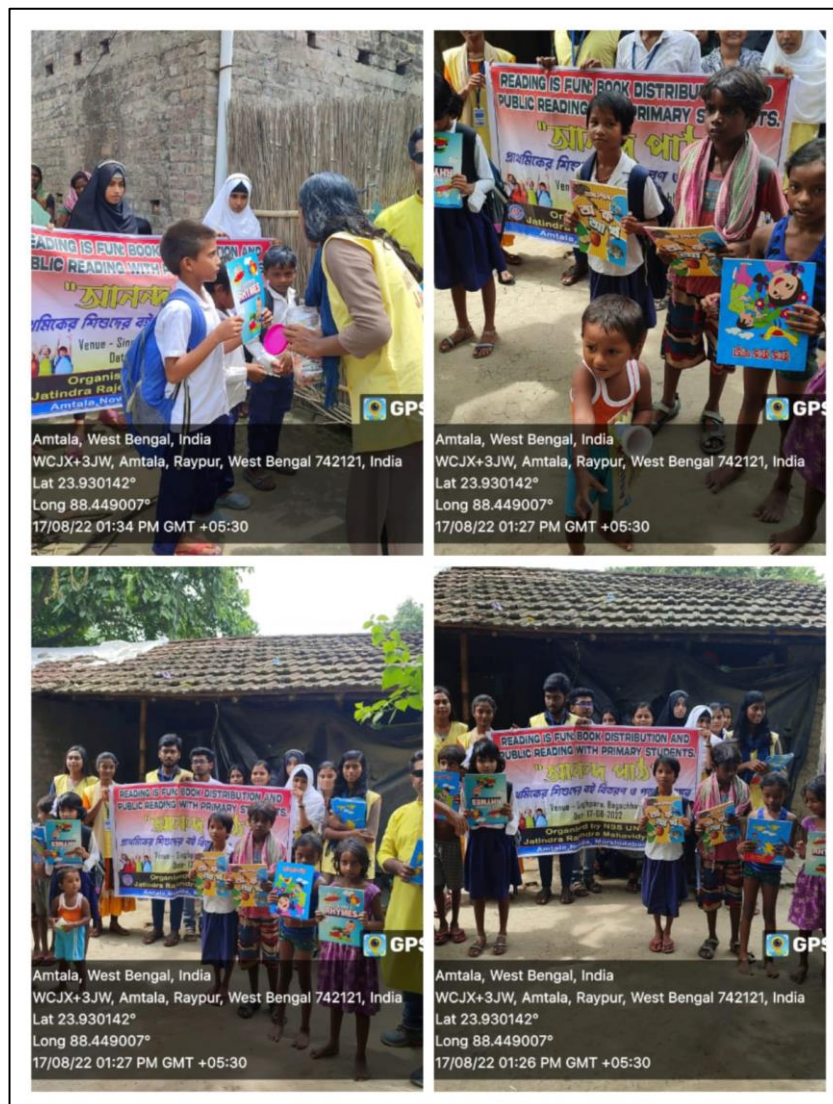



Title of the Extension Programme: A Survey on Post COVID-19 Situation

Venue of the Programme: Amtala Bazar Para & Amtala Primary School

Date of the Programme: 30/03/23

Introduction:

The worldwide outbreak of Coronavirus at the end of 2019 buckled the public health system. Countries across the world struggled to contain the fast spread of the virus as it continued to have a devastating impact on the lives of the people. India, with its vast population and complex healthcare landscape, faced unique challenges in formulating and implementing a pandemic response strategy. Since the COVID-19 pandemic in India, more than 120 million people have been pushed into poverty. The worst pandemic's consequences were felt by India's most vulnerable people in the form of job losses, increasing poverty levels, and reduced per-capita incomes. As the world transitions into a post-COVID era, the lessons learned from India's experience offer a roadmap for building stronger healthcare systems, improving disaster preparedness, and enhancing social safety nets. To better comprehend the post-COVID scenario on a regional level, the NSS Unit of Jatindra-Rajendra Mahavidyalaya conducted a survey in the Bazar Para & Primary School of Amtala on 30/03/23.

Objectives:

1. Foster greater resilience and reformation
2. Improve knowledge and understanding to better navigate the uncertainties of a post-COVID world
3. Evaluate physical and mental health in the wake of the pandemic

Activities Conducted:

The programme included the following activities:

1. Conducted door to door visit in Amtala Bazar Para to take note of medical cases of co-morbidity, vaccinations administered by brand (Covaxin, Covishield, Sputnik V, Corbevax), vaccinations administered by age group and gender, physical and mental maladies possibly triggered by the virus, etc.
2. Distributed survey forms in Amtala High School to get basic information regarding the impact of COVID-19 in the daily lives of these children and their families

3. Circulated pamphlets in both the above-mentioned school and locality to equip the commoners with the information to reorganize certain aspects of their lives in the changed times

Participation:

The convenor of the NSS Unit of J.R.M., along with **3 faculty members, 2 non-teaching staff and 29 students**, successfully conducted this extension activity. The students of Amtala Primary School and the residents of Amtala Bazar Para were extremely responsive throughout the duration of the survey and provided all the information required of them in a voluntary manner.

Programme Outcomes:

The extension programme successfully achieved its objectives with the following notable outcomes:

1. The campaign successfully accomplished all its set objectives
2. The volunteers have gathered sufficient knowledge regarding the post-pandemic condition from this activity
3. General consciousness regarding the mental health care system has been found wanting and needs to be worked upon
