
ONE DAY STATE LEVEL SEMINAR

On the Topic:

"গানে গল্পে রবীন্দ্রনাথ"

(TAGORE IN SONGS AND STORIES)

As the nationwide celebration of Tagore's legacy in the World of Literature before hand, the Department of Philosophy got privileged to organize a one day state level seminar in honour of his 160th Birth Anniversary on the topic "গানে গল্পে রবীন্দ্রনাথ" (Tagore in Songs and Stories) in collaboration with the IQAC, Jatindra Rajendra Mahavidyalaya. The Patron of the Seminar and Head of the department, Prof. Geetali Bera and the convener of seminars, Prof. Pranab Ghosh jointly collaborated with the IQAC coordinator, Prof. Subhadip Mukherjee and Chairperson of Teachers' Council, Prof. Rina Majumdar had together brought this important seminar to the





college. The venue had been the Master Seminar Hall of the college. This seminar had been assisted by the members of the academic sub-committee and the faculty members of the department of philosophy. 52 Members teachers, non-teaching staff and students participated.

The seminar was duly inaugurated on 18th August, 2022 with a grand ceremony in the seminar hall of the college. Prof. Sonali Bhattacharya, Associate Prof. Dept of Philosophy, Sewnarayan Rameswar Fatepuria College, Beldanga, Murshidabad had been the chief Guest of the seminar and also the keynote addresser. The audience of the packed hall stood in reverence and honour of Tagore. The dignitaries on the stage were duly welcomed with the bouquet of flowers, followed by the enkindling of the lamp. Then the patron of the seminar delivered her small lecture for the students, outlined a story of Tagore how he formed his school at Santiniketan outside closed door of class. She talked about the meaning of Tagore's venture on this unique of schooling. Freedom has been given to the students during their learning process. She concluded her talk by inviting the resource person, Prof. Sonali Bhattacharya to deliver her lecture.

While speaking about Tagore's thought under the guise of songs and stories, Prof. Sonali Bhattacharya pinpointed the proximate values that are written in Tagore's poems and



stories that lead to the ultimate values of humanity, humanism, universal man, and the like ideology. First of all, she briefly sketched Tagore's life that he is considered as one of the greatest litterateurs of the world, *Visva Kavi* because of here multifaceted personality. *The Gitanjali* songs are mainly poems of *bhakti* in the great Indian tradition and the current coin of India's devotional poetry is melted and minted anew by Rabindranath. Gitanjali or Song Offerings is one of the most lyrical texts ever written in the history of Indian English poetry



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dealing with devotional fervor, metaphysical reckoning, overflow of sentiment and thus, diminishing the gap between theism and atheism, strong belief and agnosticism, faith and doubt, nihilism and existentialism, strengthening the emotional bonding between the Soul and the Supreme Soul, taking the flights of imagination. Tagore's songs are replete with Indian philosophy and the essence of our glorious thoughts and traditions like bhakti tradition. She concluded that Tagore's songs are the congregation of his life-long learning and all of which he had observed since his childhood. He gathered all his learning input and gave in the form of songs.

Then Prof. Sonali Bhattacharya shifted her lecture to Tagore's stories. She says that in the short stories of Tagore we can find out the influence of man, nature and the mysteries of the supernatural. Tagore uses the picture of rural urban lives, disintegration of the old joint families, family quarrels, conflict in love and affection, conflict between religious superstitions and humanistic values. Tagore's earlier stories comprised the themes of village life that generated through his visit to a village. He experienced the bounties of Nature to glorify natural scenes and surveying panorama of rural life. In her lecture Prof. Sonali asked the audience to learn from the village beauty, natural environment and their life cycles. Then she concluded her precious lecture.

The students and the staff were all overjoyed with the talk and gave their standing applause to her. The programme coordinator Prof. Abdul Halim Shaikh then extend the dias to the convener of the seminars for the Department of Philosophy, Prof. Pranab Ghosh who thanked the dignitaries present and the students for their patience and learning spirit. After the seminars all the students were handed over a packet of tiffin.

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Theme of the Seminar:

developed a spiritual humanism that connected ancient Indian philosophical ideas with Western ideas. He believed that humans could find freedom and fulfillment through love, knowledge, and connecting their narrow self with the universal Being. His family's outlook on religion and life was influenced by transmitted writings, with 10-14 identified as orthodox. The term "Upanishad" means "sitting down near" or "sitting close to" and implies listening closely to the mystic doctrines of a guru. Tagore's philosophy also created a different base of education, emphasizing the ultimate goal of life and the ability to understand and realize the self

Tagore's songs, in contrast to certain popular, more contemporary ideologies, reveal that existence is beautiful. His lyrics paint a picture of a utopian destiny, while the unique melody works with the words to make listeners feel present in a reality where life is overflowing with honest purity. A classic Rabindra sangeet, "Anondoloke monogolaloke", preaches this idea in a manner of a religious sermon. The sanguine tone is so dominating here that a listener cannot help but find themselves intensely desiring to believe that our world contains an abundance of gratifying hope, brimming with potentials of

The entire song is about the manifestation of the divine in our surroundings. It sings:

"The Sun, Moon, the planets, stars anxiously drink and bathe

In your everlasting beam, with incredible speed.

Springs dance down the earth, what a beauty

It overall paints the picture of a world where the divine nurtures

The initial portion of the concluding part of the song asserts, "Jagote tobo ki mahotsabo, bondano kore bishwo", which means "What a great festival is there in the universe, uniting the

His song on one-sided love, "Mayabano Biharini" or "Wandering diction is not the only quality of the song: the tone and melody also major organs that give the composition its colour.

The highest point of the song reads:

"Dur hote aami taare sadhibo Gopone biroho dore badhibo Gopone biroho dore padmise Radhono-bihino shei je badhon

This roughly translates to: "I will yearn her from afar, I will secretly fasten her with the rope of separation. A tie without a tie. For no reason."

The stanza itself is wrapped in the soft coating of a pleasing tone but inside, it contains a rather depressing notion. The pleasure of this particular portion is most clearly apparent when it's heard in the voice of a singer like Chinmay Chatterjee.

Notably, this song is a bit tricky. The stanza begins with a high note, and it keeps getting higher till the completion of the second line. This dynamic repeats twice and then it abruptly reaches the low note in the third line. An excitement builds up in the first two. The repetition intensifies this excitement only to casually sway into a calmer verse. This overall composition articulates a mellifluous melancholia that may seem strange to our immediate cognition, but our subconscious self is no stranger to the feelings these lines carry. In other words, the listener feels a pleasing sweetness within the sour sore of pain.
